- On Friday, April 13th students in grades 6-12 viewed <u>Screenagers</u>. This is part of our work to educate students, families and the community about technology addiction and the impact it can have on individuals and families. The viewing was followed by a grade level discussion in students' advisories.
- On Wednesday, April 11th in collaboration with Granby Police Department and Massachusetts State Police our school was placed in a teach/shelter in place in order for the K-9 units to conduct a search of the building and parking lots. This was not done due to a specific concern, but as another measure of safety and security for students, staff and our school community. Searches like this are also an opportunity for the Massachusetts State Police K-9 units to familiarize themselves with our school in case their presence is ever required for an emergency situation. All but three classrooms were interrupted during this exercise.
